Date of Event: December 4, 2009

Description of Event:

Speaker Simón Sedillo is a community based human rights film-maker whose work has centered on placing skills, cameras and editing equipment in the hands of communities in resistance so that they may be able to document their own histories and human rights situation. He will show clips of his films and speak to issues of globalization, neoliberalism, and human rights in Oaxaca, Mexico.

Benefit to Students:

Students interested in or taking classes dealing with topics such as film, globalization, neoliberalism, America's foreign policy, indigenous communities of Mexico, and human rights more broadly would benefit greatly from Simon's lecture. Also he will be selling some of his films if students wanted to purchase them for their own organizations.

Description of Event:

To celebrate both the holiday season and the art of tap and ballroom dancing this event will include both a performance and a movie. Location of Event: Rocky 200

Date of Event: Sunday November 22, 2009

Description of Event:

The purpose of this event is talk about where the US currently stands in our foreign policy towards Cuba (including the Freedom to Travel to Cuba Act); how things have changed since Obama has come into office; about the solidarity movement with Cuba- its roots and the contemporary manifestation; about the history and "constitutionality" of the travel restrictions; to talk about past Venceremos Brigade trips and experiences from them; and about the possibility of traveling to Cuba this summer with the VB. All are welcome to attend this event.

Benefit to Students:

This lecture will help to inform the student body about a country with which the US has had a very unique relationship with for several decades, and about the effects of that relationship. We also think that it would benefit the Vassar community to be updated as to the status of our foreign policy with Cuba, especially because things have been changing since Obama was elected. Description:

CultureSHOCK is Columbia University's Asian American Association (AAA) annual conference. This year's theme is Lost and Found. It signifies the important and continual search and acceptance of the Asian American identity through the manifestation of the arts, fashion, music, dance, song, spoken word, comedy, and video skits that pervades through American culture. The conference would provide a platform for Asian American performers to showcase their craft and to increase awareness of Asian Americans in the media. The proceeds of this conference will be donated to CACF, the Coalition for Asian American Children & Families, which aims to improve the health and well-being of Asian Pacific American children and families in the New York City area.

In addition, to create a cohesive experience for our General Body, we are bringing them to the Asia Society Museum in New York City.

Benefit for students:

This conference would serve two reasons. Firstly, it was increase awareness of the members that will be attending the event. In turn, it would be channelled into on-campus events so that the depth and relevance of ASA's events can be tailored towards current issues that Asian Americans are facing today. Secondly, this would inculcate solidarity and build relationships within the East Coast Asian American community. These links would be useful for both personal and organisational development. For example, the special discount that we are receiving for these tickets was through a friend that one of our members met through a similar conference.

I anticipate that that the bulk of this semester's budget would towards this. With the 3 spoken word artists that we are bringing in, they will cost approximately \$4000.

I understand that the conference fund on subsidizes up to 10 participants. However, the circumstances are different for us. As this conference is in New York City and we have managed to receive a discount, the costs are relatively low per person. Thus we felt that it would be beneficial to bring a larger number of members. The interest level is high and we have a waitlist of people who still would like to attend. Hence, would it be possible to extend the subsidy to cover up to 24 people. Especially since, the total cost of \$1056 would be substantially less than the total maximum allowed conference fund request. It will reach out to more people for an affordable sum of money. Please consider my reasonable request. Thank you.
